In 2008, nearly 12,000 people took advantage of programs that ease and enrich the lives of youth, parents, and elders in the years immediately following immigration and well beyond.

### message from Alaric Bien

#### EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR

2008 was a busy year at CISC. In line with our strategic plan, we continued to respond to needs in our changing community by developing services outside the city of Seattle, and bringing them to where new immigrants now live and work.

We added our sixth and seventh play and learn groups serving the Kirkland Hmong community, and Redmond as well. Eastside Chinese, Vietnamese, Indian, Latino and Russian families are served through the Eastside Cultural Navigator Program, in close collaboration with Eastside Refugee and Immigrant Coalition partner agencies. In the South End, seniors can now participate in CISC activities at the Kent Senior Activity Center, reducing the need to spend hours on the bus getting to and from Seattle.

At our International Family Center – Seattle, we doubled the capacity of our after school program with academic bilingual academic assistance, family support, and bicultural identity development for Chinese and Vietnamese youth. We also partnered with a number of other community organizations to increase civic participation, voter engagement and education in Seattle and beyond.

One of the key challenges we face, even more significant this year, is how we communicate with our supporters effectively. Over the last several months, it has become clear to us that we need to do a better job of articulating what exactly CISC is, what we do, and why the organization is deserving of support.

To this end, we worked with volunteers through the Taproot Foundation to look at our brand strategy and key messages. They helped us develop better ways of communicating the essence of CISC to the public. In a nutshell, "CISC helps Asian immigrants make the transition to a new life while keeping later generations in touch with their rich heritage."

We also tapped into volunteer expertise through the Executive Development Institute to create a planned giving program and materials. These are just a few of the examples of the more than 5,000 donated volunteer hours we received in 2008, helping us to be able to more with less.

Finally, I was excited to be chosen to participate in a cross cultural exchange program between the US and Belgium examining immigrant integration issues, services, and best practices. Travelling to Belgium twice and hosting our Belgian counterparts here once in Seattle, we learned a great deal, not only from each other, but about ourselves. Despite all the challenges we face on a day to day basis, we now can say with confidence and pride that CISC's services are truly world class!



## The Road to Citizenship

When Mr. Nianzheng Guan and Mrs. Qihao Zhou began ESL classes at CISC, they were intimidated by the idea of learning a new language. It seemed impossibly difficult to acquire the needed English skills so they pushed the idea of becoming U.S. citizens to the back of their minds.

But, with the help of CISC teachers and volunteers, they improved quickly. With this boost in confidence, they took

citizenship classes and got CISC's help to apply for the USCIS Naturalization Test.

On test day, they were nervous but excited about the possibility of becoming U.S. citizens. They passed



on their first try and went straight to CISC to share the good news. Like others before them, they encouraged the newest clients, showing that becoming a citizen was not just a dream.

#### **Immigrant Transition Programs**

that help non-English speakers understand and navigate American culture

Over 6,000 individuals received comprehensive information and assistance services in Mandarin, Cantonese, Toisanese, Taiwanese, Hakka, Shanghainese, Fukienese, Chiu Chow, Hainanese, Vietnamese, Hindi, Gujarati, Spanish, Russian and English at five sites around King County.

More than 375 people participated in crime prevention education workshops and received crime victim's assistance, including domestic violence services. Many of these individuals would not have sought recourse through the justice system without CISC's intervention.

Nearly 350 students took English as a Second Language and naturalization classes, with 90 becoming new American citizens. Immigrants who become US citizens have more and better employment opportunities, have access to more services, and are more engaged in their community.

#### Family Programs with multigenerational impact

Bilingual Mandarin/English preschool helps prepare youngsters for success in kindergarten. Teachers report that all 16 of our graduates met all the state criteria for school readiness by the time they entered school in September.

Informal play and learn groups are held weekly across King County in various languages and dialects. 250 preschool children and their caregivers participated in these groups where caregivers discover how to help their children learn through play.

Older children and youth participate in our after school and summer youth programs. 80 youth aged 6-17 received academic assistance, one on one tutoring, and took part in activities for bilingual/bicultural identity development. This program also works intensely with parents and teachers. In addition, more than 75 families participated in bilingual parent education and family counseling services.

Over 6,000 individuals received family support services, including help for those caring for their elderly relatives at home. At our International Family Center-Seattle, 1,000 families received help through 17,250 individual visits during the year.

#### Employment and Technology Programs to prepare adults and youth for success

CISC helped 240 limited English speaking individuals through pre-employment, placement, and job retention services. We also served 400 people from youth to senior citizens with multilingual computer training.

Newly immigrated teenagers learned basic computer skills and worked on career planning. Working aged adults improved their word processing, spreadsheet and database applications. Workshops on desktop publishing and financial accounting focused on entrepreneurs and small businesses.

Elder Programs that promote health, independence, fellowship, and lifelong learning 875 seniors received services either in their own homes or at one of nine different sites across King County. Case management services to help them continue living independently, health monitoring, recreational activities, social gatherings, and education help keep our elderly neighbors health, active and engaged in their community. Our oldest client turned 108 this year and is still going strong.

#### Cultural Programs that strengthen the bonds of family and community

Hundreds and hundreds of individuals participated in arts classes and exhibitions, Mandarin and Cantonese classes, and celebrations of traditional Chinese and other Asian and American festivals.



# Overcoming Despair

Nailya Minigulova arrived in the US with multiple medical problems which prevented her from finding a job.
With no medical insurance, she was in a difficult situation. In addition, her young son was unable to attend school due to severe speech and vision difficulties.

She contacted a Russian Cultural
Navigator at CISC. He filled out
DSHS' change-of-circumstances form,
enabling Nailya and her son to
receive medical coupons and referrals
to specialists. Nailya received free
surgery from the Virginia Mason
Medical Center, and CISC found a
pediatric specialist for her son. The
boy received vision therapy, and
to the delight of his parents, CISC
helped him enroll in a school for
special needs children.

In the meantime, Nailya looks forward to further improving both her and her son's health. She has found new hope and now sees great prospects for the future.


